John F. Duffy

John F. Duffy is a Professor of Law at the George Washington University Law School. Professor Duffy received an A.B. in physics from Harvard College in 1985 and a J.D. from the University of Chicago in 1989. He was awarded an Olin Fellowship in Law and Economics at the University of Chicago and served as Articles Editor on the University of Chicago Law Review. Prior to entering academics, Professor Duffy clerked for Stephen Williams on the United States Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit and for Justice Scalia on the United States Supreme Court, served as an Attorney-Advisor in the Department of Justice's Office of Legal Counsel, and practiced law with the Washington firm of Covington & Burling. Professor Duffy has taught at the Cardozo School of Law (1996-2000), the William & Mary Law School (2000-2003), the University of Chicago Law School (winter and spring of 2003), and the New York University School of Law (spring 2005).

Professor Duffy teaches patent law and is the co-author of a casebook on the subject, *PATENT LAW AND POLICY* (3rd ed. 2002) (with Robert Patrick Merges). He has published articles on regulatory law and intellectual property in the *Texas Law Review*, the *Columbia Law Review*, *Supreme Court Review*, the *Berkeley Journal of Law and Technology*, and the *University of Chicago Law Review*.
